A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

[Matthew 2:1-2] Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him."


Brothers and sisters in Christ,

The feast of Epiphany is celebrated every January 6 after the 12 days of Christmas. "Epiphany" comes from a word meaning manifestation or revealing. This day celebrates the revealing of Christ to the Magi from the East. These individuals are the first non-Jews to recognize Jesus and honor him, prefiguring that Christ is not just king of the Jews, but king of the whole world, of all peoples.

One of the inspiring things about the Magi is that they take what little light they are given and they act upon it. They are willing to make a long, dangerous journey, following the truth

wherever it leads. This is a very different attitude than King Herod and the religious leaders have. The religious leaders are asked where the Messiah is to be born. They know the answer, they know the Scriptures, they have the correct knowledge. But what happens after that? As far as we know, none of them get up and go to Bethlehem to find the Messiah.

The Magi, who do not have all the right knowledge or family background, act on the light they are given, though much less than the



religious leaders, and meet Jesus. They experience Jesus. They have a real-life encounter with Christ. The Scriptures and teaching of the Church are meant to lead us to a real relationship with the living Christ. The Christian life is not just about knowing the right answers and memorizing Scripture verses. There is nothing wrong with those, of course. But they are a means to an end,

rather than an end in themselves. These are meant to be means of God's grace leading us to receive and participate in the life of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Friends, may you act on the light God has given you and follow the truth wherever it leads you, even when it leads you to some unknown, unfamiliar place like Bethlehem.

May you trust in the One who guides you and is inviting you into deeper communion with Himself.

And may you, like the Magi, come bearing gifts of honor and sacrifice to the King of Kings.

Everlasting God, the radiance of faithful souls, You brought the nations to Your light and kings to the brightness of Your rising. Fill the world with Your glory, and show Yourself to all the nations;

through Him who is the True Light and the Bright and Morning Star,

even Jesus Christ Your Son and our Lord. Amen. (Latin Sacramentary, 5th- 7th Cent.) In Christ,

From the introduction:

The Washington Post recently asked readers to describe today's world in a single word. Some of the answers were unfit for a family newspaper, but the top three responses were: exhausting, lost, chaotic. Who doesn't feel that way? What can we do about it?
