A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

[Luke 2:22] And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, Christians around the world celebrate February 2 as the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple.

The Presentation is one of the oldest feasts in the history of the Church, going back to at least the fourth century. The feast is based on the event told to us in the Gospel of Luke 2:22-40. According to the Torah, a woman was unclean for 40 days after giving birth to a son. Now the time had come, the 40th day, when Jesus' parents were to go to the Temple for Mary's purification

and the offerings prescribed in Leviticus 12 for the firstborn child. This feast is celebrated on February 2 because this date marks 40 days since the celebration of Christmas on December 25.

We're told that Joseph and Mary bring the prescribed offering if one is unable to afford a lamb. Of course, in one sense, they have already brought the lamb when they bring Jesus to the Temple! A man named Simeon "righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel," picks up the child Jesus, and utters a prophecy (now known as the Song of Simeon):

"Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, According to Your word; For my eyes have seen Your salvation Which You have prepared before the face of all peoples, A light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, And the glory of Your people Israel." (Luke 2:29-32)

The Holy Spirit had revealed to Simeon that we would not see death before he had seen the promised Messiah, the Christ. Now, as Mary and Joseph bring their child to the Temple to fulfill the customs of the Law, Simeon believes God's promise has been fulfilled. He tells God that he can now "depart in peace." After Simeon gives another prophecy to Mary that foreshadows the tragic death Jesus will face, we are told of a prophetess, Anna, who also was a person of deep faith and devotion. Upon seeing Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, she began to give thanks to God and to speak of

him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2:38).

While for many, Epiphany on January 6 marks the close of the Christmas season after the 12 days, some traditionally leave up Christmas decorations until this 40th day of the season. February 2 goes by another name, as well: Candlemas. This comes from the practice of taking candles

to one's local church where they are blessed and then used for the remainder of the year. These blessed candles, blessed on the day we celebrate Christ's presentation at the temple, serve as symbols of Christ being the true light of the world. In his prophecy over the Christ child, Simeon refers to Jesus as, "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32).

May we take this day to give thanks for the light of God that shines in our hearts, and that "He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son" (Colossians 1:13). And may we ask for God's blessing that His light may shine out from us, allowing it to shine for our families, our friends, our neighbors, a world groping in the darkness.

Collect for the Presentation of Christ in the Temple:

Almighty and everliving God, we humbly pray that, as Your only-begotten Son was this day presented in the temple in the substance of our flesh, so we may be presented to You with pure and clean hearts by Jesus Christ our Lord; Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. *Pastor Ty*
