A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

[Luke 24:30-31] When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him.

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are approaching Lent. Lent is often considered a time for us to give things up, to fast from certain foods, to sacrifice certain comforts or luxuries as we seek to identify with the sacrificial way of Christ. Lent can also be a good time to take things up, try a new spiritual discipline or practice.

This Lenten season, as a church, we are going to take up the historic practice of weekly Communion. For most of the Church's history, worship on Sunday has been a service of Word and Table. Coming to Christ's Table each Lord's Day puts us in good company with the historic Church, most Christians around the world today, and honors our Methodist heritage.

"If Communion loses its importance, it's not Communion's fault." My pastor in college was fond of saving these words, knowing that the college students that made up his congregation came from a variety of backgrounds with differing perspectives on the Lord's Table. The church he served was rooted in the Lutheran tradition, which practices Communion (or, as they called it "Eucharist") weekly. He would say these words in response to the objection that if Communion becomes a weekly practice it could seem "less special" or become routine. His answer to this was that if this is the case, it is not Communion's fault. The fault lies with the Christian who has let the Lord's Table become routine or less special. He wanted us to know that if something is important, it doesn't mean you do it less often. We certainly do not apply that same logic to reading the Scriptures, praying, or the preaching of sermons in our worship services.

Along with most Protestant Christians, we Methodists believe in two sacraments: Baptism and Holy Communion. Baptism is a one-time means of grace that is the doorway, the entrance into the life of the Church and the other means of grace. The Lord's Supper is ongoing food and sustenance for the journey of faith. Communion is where, in addition to the Word, we are strengthened and equipped by God's grace to live the Christian life.

Communion also gives us the opportunity to connect with God in ways that go beyond our mental capacity (i.e., our ability to listen to and understand a sermon). Rather, we engage Christ, who is present at His table, with the senses that He created us with: our sight, our hearing, our smelling, our touching, and our tasting. As our senses are attuned more and more to Christ at His table, they are trained to be more perceptive of His presence throughout the week. The Communion table disciples our senses.

Spiritual father of the Methodist movement John Wesley preached a sermon titled "Constant Communion," advocating for frequent and regular participation in the Lord's Table. He begins by saying, "I am to show that it is the duty of every Christian to receive the Lord's Supper as often as he can." One of Wesley's main points is that to practice Communion is to obey the command of Christ, who tells His disciples, "Do this in remembrance of Me." Wesley remarks that there are no other commands of Jesus we seek to only do sparingly to maintain their importance. Why should we not seek to keep this command as frequently as possible, as occasion allows?

As we embark on the Lenten journey together, we have an opportunity to avail ourselves of one of the primary ways Christ reveals Himself to His people. We read in Luke 24, after the risen Christ had walked with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, "When he was at table with them, he took the bread and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened, and they recognized him" (Luke 24:30-31). Each week, as we participate in the Communion liturgy, we remember the story of salvation through the prayer called the Great Thanksgiving. Each week we prepare ourselves through examination and confession. Each week, no matter how good or bad the sermon is, we meet the Lord Jesus Christ at His table. Each week, no matter how good or bad we have been, on Sunday we obey His command: "Do this in remembrance of Me."


